Sub: **Grant of Conditional Permission to the Govt. Ayurved Medical College, Dhanwantari Road, Bangalore Karnataka with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 40 seats in 06 PG courses namely (i) Dravyaguna -07 seats, (ii) Rasashastra & Bhaisajyakalpana- 06 seats, (iii) Rognidan avum Vikriti Vigyan-06 seats, (iv) Shalya Tantra -07 seats, (v) shalakya tantra- 07 seats and (vi) Panchkarma -07 seats for the academic session 2019-20 under section 13A/13C of the IMCC Act, 1970- reg.**

Sir/Madam,


I am directed to refer to the Ministry's order No. No.R.17011/40/2018-EP (IM-1) dated 04.08.2018 related to admission matter for the academic year 2018-19 intimating certain shortcomings for rectification for consideration of the case for the academic year 2019-20.

2. The CCIM had carried out an inspection of the institution on 06-07.03.2019 to reassess the available facilities of teaching and practical training as well as to verify the compliance submitted by the college and forwarded its recommendations and report to the Ministry. On examining the same, certain deficiencies have been observed and therefore, under provisions of the first proviso to sub-section (5) of Section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970, an opportunity of hearing was granted to the college on 07.05.2019 to present the case.

3. The observations of hearing committee based on submission made by the college representatives during hearing and recommendations & visitation report of the CCIM have been carefully examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the “Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016”, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder and as per approved Standard Operative Procedures (SOPs) and it is found that the College is fulfilling notified and approved criterion for granting Conditional Permission for UG (BAMS) course and PG Courses. *Bink Jitay*

3. It has, therefore, been decided by the Central Government to grant **Conditional Permission to Govt. Ayurved Medical College, Dhanwantari Road, Banglore Karnataka** for conducting 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 40 seats in 06 PG courses namely (i) Dravyaguna -07 seats, (ii) Rasashastra & Bhaisajyakalpana- 06 seats, (iii) Rognidan avum Vikriti Vigyan-06 seats, (iv) Shalya Tantra -07 seats , (v) shalakyta tantra- 07 seats and (vi) Panchkarma -07 seats for the academic session 2019-20 under Section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970.
4. It is further informed that 15% of undergraduate and 15% of post graduate of the permitted intake capacity of 100 UG seats and 40 PG seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quotas shall be conducted by the Central Government and counseling for the remaining 85% seats shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State. If any seats are not filled up in the Central Counseling, the same shall be transferred to the said Counseling Authority to admit students as per their rules/ reservation policies/norms. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to co-operate with the Central counseling for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
5. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as irregular and action will be initiated under IMCC Act & Regulations made thereunder.
6. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of CCIM and the Central Government.
7. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2019 to get permission for the session 2020-21:
- all the Requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
 - all the requirements under the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled *in toto*; and
 - all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 for grant of permission to PG courses.
8. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to CCIM under intimation to this Ministry. The CCIM will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled by means of an inspection and submit a report along with its assessment in this matter to the Ministry of AYUSH for considering the permission matter from the academic session 2020-21.
9. This issued with the approval of Competent Authority.
